## **Mission:**

National Art Honor Society (NAHS) is open to high school students, grades 9-12 for the purpose of inspiring and recognizing students who have shown an outstanding ability in and commitment to the arts.

NAHS strives to aid members in working toward the attainment of the highest standards in the art areas, and to bring art education to the attention of the school and community.

NAHS welcomes all students who desire to use their art skills to improve the quality and condition of Druid Hills High School.

## **Dues:**

\$10.00 for Freshman, Sophomores and Juniors  
\$22.00 for SENIORS (this includes your honor cord)

## **NAHS Leadership Team:**

All leadership members share the responsibility for planning, running and generating ideas for meetings. The team works as a unit to serve and represent NAHS members. Students interested in serving as leaders should demonstrate initiative, follow through and work well collaboratively.

**Speaker:** *Serves as a liaison between the sponsors, leadership team and NAHS members*

This member ensures at least two leadership members are represented at all official meetings and oversees that all duties held by the leadership team are fulfilled. This member is responsible for leading the generation of ideas for art projects, events and community involvement.

**Communication Manager:** *Ensures that all communication within the society is shared*

This member sends emails, takes attendance, makes notes and tracks NAHS members' points.

**Project Coordinator:** *Organizes/plans all NAHS projects/events and collects funds*

This member oversees projects onsite and monitors quality and distribution of work. The Project Coordinator collects dues from members, provides a receipt and keeps the books for collected funds. All money collected will be submitted to the sponsors who will give a receipt.

**Marketing Manager:** *Manages NAHS social media, and advertising*

This member works closely with the Photographer

**Photographer:** *Visually documents all aspects of NAHS*

This member works with Spotlight and Yearbook for advocacy of NAHS in the Druid Hills community.

### **National Art Honor Society Bylaws:**

**Section 1.** To remain a member in good standing, a member must pay dues and attend a minimum of 8 meetings throughout one academic school year.

**Section 2.** Annual dues of \$10.00 for freshman, sophomores and juniors and \$22.00 from seniors will be collected from each member. *\*This does not cover the cost of the annual NAHS Conference*

**Section 3.** Students must not be absent more than **6 NAHS meetings during the school year**. Any reasons beyond three absences will be reviewed by the leadership team and sponsors of the DHHS National Art Honor Society Chapter. Five absences will be reviewed by the DHHS Art Department, and your membership may be revoked. **If you are a senior and miss more than 5 NAHS meetings during the school YOU WILL NOT RECEIVE YOUR HONOR CORD.** If you are a junior and you miss more than 5 NAHS meetings during your Junior year, you will not be eligible to receive an honor cord your senior year.

**Section 4.** All members must participate in our projects, activities, and fundraisers. Members may pick and choose to participate in which projects, activities and fundraisers best suit their strengths and interests. But members must participate!

**Section 5.** For the NAHS Leadership Team, attendance is also required at any executive meetings called outside of the regularly scheduled meetings.

**Section 6.** To graduate with NAHS honors and earn the right to wear a cord, pin, or tassel at graduation, a member must remain in good standing until the graduation date.

- Senior Students must receive a minimum **of 20 NAHS points their SENIOR YEAR.**
- Junior Students must receive a minimum **of 10 NAHS points their JUNIOR YEAR.**
- **INCOMING SENIORS must receive a minimum of 25 NAHS points.**

**\*THIS MEANS YOU NEED A TOTAL OF 30 POINTS TO OBTAIN AN HONOR CORD\***

**Section 7.** In order to receive an honor cord your Senior year, you must have taken at least 2 or more art classes throughout your 4 year high school experience at DHHS. (Art classes from other high schools also count). Members must retain

an overall “A” average in an advanced art class, AP Art Class or IB Art Class and 80% or higher in a Visual Arts I class.

**Section 8.** Members may remain active during such time when there are no visual arts on their class schedules as long as they fulfill all of the other requirements each year.

**Section 9.** In the event of an infraction of rules, a review by the officers and sponsors will be conducted. If the individual in question is an officer, he/she will not participate in the decision-making process.

**Section 10.** Students must be a National Art Honor Society member at the beginning of their senior year.

### **National Art Honor Society Points System:**

If you are a SENIOR, in order to receive a NAHS Art Cord you must fulfill the following requirements. Keep a record of your points and report all your points to the Communication Manager.
